





























The STEAM cart is back at the library, with some new additions. We have purchased two additional Fire Tablets, allowing more children to play and learn with the OSMO applications simultaneously.





Logging was a massive commercial industry in Hastings Highlands when the area was first being settled. The York River was used to drive the logs to the mills that had settled along the banks of the river. Logging Barons in our area were: Hugo Rathbun, Allan Gilmour and Billa Flint.

Ice skates were a common Christmas gift. With the many opportunities in our area to go skating, it was a very popular pastime. Skates have changed a lot over the years, starting with those tied to the bottom of boots, to what they are today.

> Democrat aka: Horse and Buggy were the affordable choice for transportation up till the 1940's when cars were more readily available, but a lot of families could still not afford their own. These could be used to move commercial goods from the train station to the store, for easy transportation in the snow, and to go for sleigh rides during holidays.





Look for these stickers on the spine. This program is very easy to participate in, just ask us to add them to your curbside orders!




Blue Spruce: JK- Grade 2, Picture Books


Silver Birch: Gr 5-6, Fiction
